#### Consent:

<u>Body Hansen</u>: I have a correction on the motion. My understanding was that we redid the motion that we would allow the already scheduled waterslide and going forward no more until we had risk regulations in place. My concern is if Pleasant View has ownership in the waterslide we have liability. Motion was made by <u>CM Gibson</u> to go into a public hearing to amend the 2018-2019 Fiscal Year Budget, Resolution 2018-L. 2<sup>nd</sup> <u>CM Hansen</u>. Voting aye: CM Burns, CM Chugg, CM Gibson, CM Hansen & CM Urry. 5-0

<u>Laurie Hellstrom</u> reviewed the resolution listing the amendments. <u>CM Burns</u>: asked for comments from the public. None were given.

<u>Jay Palmer</u>: it is the same as last year. It is still on the state contract and we are purchasing a semi load. <u>CM Chugg</u>: what is the benefit? <u>Jay Palmer</u>: no charge for delivery. <u>CM Gibson</u>: they have it when they need it.

I will take this on again. Ryon Hadley: we hired a couple more substitute crossing guards.

<u>Bill Cobabe</u>: there is a memo on the Multi-Sports Park. <u>CM Burns</u>: can we apply again for the park?

<u>Laurie Hellstrom</u>: who wants to go the League Conference? Jill Hunt needs to know to register everyone.

<u>CM Chugg</u>: what is this report 'Moderate Housing Reporting Form' that is six years overdue? Bill Cobabe: I will take care of that.

<u>CM Gibson</u>: trees are dying on the walking path. <u>CM Burns</u>: they are getting the water but we need trees that like the soil there. <u>CM Gibson</u>: our walking path looks great.

<u>CM Burns</u>: the grass is growing at Shady Lane Park but we need to stop vehicles from driving on it. <u>Jay Palmer</u>: we will place rocks with bollards. <u>CM Burns</u>: there was a ribbon cutting at Capstone Academy. They have approximately 120 students.
