Motion was made by <u>CM Gibson</u> to appoint Andy Nef & Dean Stokes to the Planning Commission with the term of appointment to extend through January 2027. 2<sup>nd</sup> by <u>CM Urry</u>. Voting Aye: CM Gibson, CM Marriott, CM Nelsen and CM Urry. 4-0

4. Rezone Request. Discussion and possible action to consider a rezone request from RE-15 to RE-20 located between Pleasant View Drive and HWY 89 and northwest of Budge Lane, parcel #19-014-0078, Ordinance 2023-1. (*Presenter: Brandon Bell*)

<u>Brandon Bell</u>: the applicant is working on a 4-lot subdivision and this parcel will be combined in the subdivision. It is a zone change from RE-15 to RE-20. It is a clean-up item. The planning commission voted 4-0 to recommend approval. The parcel is .015 acres.

Motion was made by <u>CM Marriott</u> to approve the rezone request from RE-15 to RE-20 located between Pleasant View Drive and HWY 89 and northwest of Budge Lane, parcel #19-014-0078, Ordinance 2023-1. 2<sup>nd</sup> by <u>CM Nelsen</u>. Roll call vote. Voting Aye: CM Gibson, CM Marriott, CM Nelsen and CM Urry. 4-0

5. Conditional Use and Site Plan Request. Discussion and possible action to consider a Conditional Use and Site Plan for the construction of a single-family home at Waterfall Drive Lot #28 Pole Patch II Subdivision. (Presenter: Brandon Bell)

Brandon Bell: the code requires a conditional use permit in the sensitive lands and both the planning commission and city council need to consider it. The planning commission recommended approval. In the last few days I have found other conditions. It is in an A-5 zone and single-family uses can be allowed. Accessory uses are not formally allowed. Staff is recommending approval of the residence but the accessory needs a text amendment. We felt this was the best way to handle the issue. The requested accessory building is approx. 1,000 sq.ft. Mayor Call: not allowing accessory uses in A-5 is odd and was probably overlooked. CM Gibson: the houses are big and there can only be ¼ acre buildable area and so much green area. The area needs to be cleaned up. It is being abused up there. Brandon Bell: I addressed impervious surface and irrigation in my staff report. The recommendation is to approve with a text amendment and adjust the distance from fault line to 15 feet. Mayor Call: there are also the seven recommendations in the staff report.

Motion was made by <u>CM Urry</u> to approve a conditional use permit and site plan for the construction of a single-family home at Waterfall Drive Lot #28 Pole Patch II Subdivision with staff recommendation as listed in the planning report. 2<sup>nd</sup> by <u>CM Marriott</u>. Voting Aye: CM Marriott, CM Nelsen and CM Urry. Voting Nay: CM Gibson. 3-1

CM Nelsen: the A-2 zone also needs to be corrected.

6. City Boundary Adjustment. Discuss the interest of the City Council to adjust the City Boundary for a future Resolution adoption.

The area for the boundary adjustment was shown on Weber County GIS. Water was discussed. Creating unbuildable lots was discussed. The council gave the thumbs up for staff to proceed with the process.

7. Vacate Public Street Clarification. Discussion and possible action to consider a resolution providing clarification of Ordinance 2022-30 adopted on October 25, 2022 to vacate certain public street in Weber View Subdivision, Resolution 2023-A. (*Presenter: Amy Mabey*)

<u>Amy Mabey</u>: you have seen this before. The Weber County Recorders Office was concerned with the language and did not have enough specificity of the lots. This is a catch all. This is for vacations in the 1960 subdivision.

Motion was made by <u>CM Gibson</u> to approve Resolution 2023-A as stated (a resolution providing clarification of Ordinance 2022-30 adopted on October 25, 2022 to vacate certain public street in Weber View Subdivision). 2<sup>nd</sup> by <u>CM Nelsen</u>. Roll call vote. Voting Aye: CM Gibson, CM Marriott, CM Nelsen and CM Urry. 4-0

# 8. Council Member Committee Appointments. Discuss City Council Member appointments to committees and various Council Member assignments. (*Presenter: Mayor Call*)

Motion was made by <u>CM Urry</u> to approve appointment changes (final copy attached). 2<sup>nd</sup> by CM Gibson. Voting Aye: CM Gibson, CM Marriott, CM Nelsen and CM Urry. 4-0

### 9. RAMP Grant Applications. Discuss applications of interest for 2023 RAMP process, EZ Grants and future application items.

Amy Mabey: we returned the \$315K RAMP grant from last year. The cost estimate is \$1.2 to \$1.4 million. The PVPA (Pickleball Association) wants to scale back the project and just do the courts and then do the parking the next year. They still need to do fund raising. We received a letter from North Ogden asking for support on their pickleball court/restroom/trailhead. There is still time to apply for easy grants.

Motion was made by <u>CM Nelsen</u> to go into the closed meeting to discuss security. 2<sup>nd</sup> by <u>CM Urry</u>. Roll call vote. Voting aye: CM Gibson, CM Marriott, CM Nelsen & CM Urry. 4-0 Mayor Call signed a sworn statement affirming the reason for the closed meeting.

Motion was made by <u>CM Gibson</u> to end the closed meeting. 2<sup>nd</sup> by <u>CM Marriott</u>. Voting aye: CM Gibson, CM Marriott, CM Nelson & CM Urry. 4-0

Action from the closed meeting:

Motion was made by <u>CM Gibson</u> to award the bid for the security system to Pro Edge for the office and park in the amount of \$31,672.88. 2<sup>nd</sup> by <u>CM Marriott</u>. Voting aye: CM Gibson, CM Marriott, CM Nelson & CM Urry. 4-0
